In it, Vanka tells him about the enduring hardships he is (the shoemaker's mistreatment, the misery he lives in, the loneliness he feels...) and finally begs him to let him come live with him in his village.

At the top of a hill, a centuries-old oak tree, which had lived for four centuries, stood as a beacon for sailors and a refuge for all kinds of birds. For almost the entire year, the tree remained awake, offering its shade and home to doves and owls. Only during the winter did it immerse itself in sweet dreams. This tale, which invites reflection on this life and the next, unfolds in a Christmas setting, addressing values such as generosity and kindness. Ideal for


